UNIFORM

Thank you to the many parents who have ensured their child is wearing the correct uniform. Enrolment at Holy Family indicates that each child will abide strictly with our school's dress code. This code states that each child will wear full and correct uniform to school each day. This includes the correct ginning of the school year. Our theme this coloured hair ties/bows. The only exceptions to this are when the school holds an "out of uniform" day or it's your child's birthday. Parents are asked to strongly support this rule making sure that shoes are of the correct type - BLACK LEATHER school shoes and the school bag has the school's logo. Fluro sneakers/laces are not part of our uniform code at Holy Family. The only jewellery permitted are a watch and stud earrings.

ANIMALS AT SCHOOL

Parents are reminded that animals should not be brought to school unless it has been arranged with the teaching staff.

Many children have allergies to cats, dogs, rabbits, fur etc. and we must ensure their safety. If the visit is pre-arranged and approved then special arrangements can be made for students with allergies. It is Catholic Education policy that dogs are not allowed on school premises – even dogs on leads. Once again this is for the safety of all children.

CANTEEN FUN FOOD DAYS

We thought we'd provide some information that might enable our new families to understand why we have these days. Very simply, the Fun Food Days are a money making exercise. The canteen will close if we can't generate this money.

Most parents view the canteen as a treat for their child. Most families do not regularly order from the canteen and many children are not prepared to buy over the counter at recess and lunchtimes as they would rather be out there playing. Most children's lunchboxes prepared at home are VERY healthy and so I believe that parents don't often order lunches for their children when they can give their children healthy foods from home.

For 192 school days the canteen is an AMBER / GREEN canteen. No unhealthy foods are sold - A small amount of amber foods are sold. For 8 days (2 days each term) we have FUN Food Days. Parents have the <u>option</u> of ordering on this day. If you do not wish your child to have a lunch order then that is perfectly fine. I am fairly certain that the majority of families would have a takeaway night several times a term. The FUN Food Day is considered to be a treat.

Michael Cook, the Canteen manager, is often working on his own in the canteen - we have very few parent volunteers to assist him, so it means that for FUN Food Days much of what is offered needs to be easy to deliver.

It is never intended that the canteen be a profit making business - rather a service to our families.

Without the 8 Red Food Days in the year we would definitely need to close the canteen!

We have had to close the canteen for over the counter sales at lunch time on Fridays as we have no parent volunteers and Michael needs to pack 150 lunch orders on his own. **Fun Food Day Wednesday 18 March**

SCHOOL BANKING DAY IS MONDAY

Students can bring in their banking on Mondays and send it to the front office via the classroom blue bag, or it can be dropped off directly to the front office. If bank books are not in by Monday afternoon, the student's banking will be kept and banked the following week.

PARENT NETWORK

STUDENT ABSENCES

Parents, please note that even if you have made a phone call informing the school that your child is away (and for one day this is not necessary, longer absences we do appreciate a phone call), we still need a <u>written note</u>, <u>email or Skoolbag App notification</u> upon their return explaining the absence. Otherwise your child will be marked as ABSENT WITHOUT REASON in the Class Roll.

If a child arrives at school after 9.00am they need to be signed in, after 9.30am, they are marked as absent for the morning and a note will need to be provided explaining why he/she was late. Holy Family Primary School is regularly audited by the Education Department regarding Student Absences. Every week we have to send in a report of children (named) who have been absent that week and a reason for their absence.

HOME READING

Home reading should be an enjoyable, stress-free activity where students can practice and consolidate their skills and really learn to love literature.

Kinder parents should make every effort to come along to the workshop shortly to give them some strategies on how to help their child learn to read.

If your child arrives home with a library book or home reader that is challenging, why don't you try echo reading or just read the book to them. If it's too easy, congratulate them and stress how much fun and easy reading is. Children need to see themselves as readers. Often children who struggle to read lack confidence and ability to take risks with their learning.

Students in the older grades are also required to read NIGHTLY. Parents are asked to assist teachers with closely monitoring the home reading. In our experience many older children choose not to read. Children in Years 2-6, who are beyond level 30, move on to Literacy Pro (Lexiles).

Many of the books in the library have been grouped according to this framework. Children complete regular on-line comprehension tests to ensure they are reading at their 'lexile level'. The school has also invested in quite a bit of money to purchase 'readers' for the older students.

Some parents query the Building Fund Contribution This donation is collected and sent to the Catholic Education Building and Maintenance section. This enables Catholic systemic schools in the ACT to be supported through a central body. All our electrical, plumbing, painting, glass repairs and internal maintenance work is undertaken through this CE department. Over the last few years, this money has enabled this school alone to have new carpet in E and F Blocks, roofing and plumbing problems repaired, flood damage repaired, painting in E and F Blocks etc. NSW schools in the Archdiocese have to pay for their own maintenance and repairs.

Families who have an older sibling at MacKillop, St Clare's or Merici Colleges and have notified us by returning a form have received a discount on their primary school fees. An administration fee of \$50 will be charged for any fee adjustments that need to be made if you qualify but have failed to return the form.

MEDICAL ALERTS

If your child suffers from a medical condition that requires treatment at school the front office you must provide an Action Plan. Please check the accuracy of the information and take whatever action is necessary (ie. fill in a new Action Plan or let us know in writing if your child no longer suffers from previously recorded conditions) to ensure we have up to date information for your child if emergency treatment is required. Relevant forms can be obtained from the Front Office.

The school policy requires all children with Anaphylaxis to supply the school with an epipen and Action Plan signed by your doctor. The school has purchased three epipens which are taken to the ovals at lunch and recess times. They will be used at the Front Office during the day if needed. Your child's epipen will be with their teacher in their classroom and taken to specialist classes, on excursions, to carnivals etc.

SUN SAFE & HATS

As part of the Holy Family Sun Smart Policy all students must wear a hat when playing outdoors all year round. This includes before school, recess, lunch and at any other outdoor school/ class activity. The NO HAT! NO PLAY! rule is enforced by all teachers. Children who do not have a hat are asked to sit in the the end of the week. Any nomination forms submitted after shade on the benches outside the Admin block.

The school hat is a navy blue legionnaire, bucket or broadbrimmed style. For convenience, school hats are available for purchase at the school from the Front Office and the Clothing Pool (open on Friday afternoons 2.30 – 3.30pm) at a cost of \$13.

SICKNESS AT SCHOOL **GUIDELINES FOR PARENTS/GUARDIANS**

Parents will be contacted when their child receives a knock to

the head, sustains an injury that is considered serious or in need of feeling ill requiring extended supervision, complains of a severe headache and presents at school with an infectious or contagious illness. When contacted, parents will be asked to collect their child or make other arrangements, as we are unable to provide the necessary supervision for such cases at school. In extreme situations we will negotiate the best possible solution with the parents eq. take the child to hospital for a second opinion.

LITERACY PRO/LEXILES

Matching Readers to Books

If you have a child in Year 3 or your child is new to Holy Family in Years 4, 5 or 6, you may have heard a new word at home....Lexiles. Students in Years 3, 4, 5 and 6 who are reading at a PM level of 30 will participate in Literacy Pro this

What is a Lexile? A Lexile is a unit that measures the amount of challenge presented by a passage of text. It measures reading comprehension. If we know the Lexile measure of a book and we know the Lexile measure of a child, we can tell how the book matches the child's reading ability – whether it is too easy, too difficult or just right. When a reader has the same Lexile level as the book they are reading, they are positioned to read that book with competence, confidence and control.

The students in Years 3, 4, 5 and 6 take the Lit Pro Test each term. This test will assess their reading ability and comprehension. They are awarded a Lexile level at the end of the test. The students then select, borrow and read books within their Lexile range. These books are located in our library or even the local Public Library. They can complete motivational guizzes on the computer to check their comprehension of the book read and earn points and certificates for the books they read successfully. 


Home Learning at Holy Family
